Our patrols have shown total dedication to getting the job done in providing our local community with a highly professional volunteer service of which all members can be justifiably proud, each of the patrols with many and varied incidents that were handled in a truly professional manner. Congratulations to all patrol members and supporters.

With patrols and protecting our beach is the highest priority for us as a club we need to ensure our patrol member are equipped with the best tools and equipment possible, over the past 12 months we were we in a good financial position to invest back into these focus areas with the help of some very generous sponsors we were able replace majority of our aging and out dated patrolling equipment.

"The objectives of the Club shall be to minimise the loss of life by applying effective lifesaving skills and beach patrol services" 2017/2018 was another successful season for North Curl Curl SLSC. The beach was open more regularly than it had been over the past few years, which was a positive for everyone. The great news is no one was seriously hurt whilst we were patrolling the beach. Through the hard work of our trainers, we gained fourteen or so new bronze members along with a number of SRC converts with existing members improving on their skills. Most importantly, and for the 96th year in succession, no lives were lost while our club was in charge of the beach.

However, we did loose someone. Long standing Club Member, Ray Merton left Australia to follow his aerospace career in Vancouver, Canada. Whilst at North Curl Curl Ray was actively involved with all facets of our club. He patrolled, was a trainer, among the first to volunteer for any task, meticulous in setting swimming distances for the Three Points Challenge, arranged anchors like his life depended on it, assessed new skills in his blue shirt, competed, spent time on The Board, was a mentor to some and a friend to many. Ray did have a habit of ruffling others' feathers but more often than not the reason behind it was sound. His presence in all of these areas will be missed, but probably not by the surfers that had to get out of the way as Ray came haring through the line-up on his surf-ski. Thanks for vour work and dedication over the years Ray. On behalf of all at North Curl Curl, we hope your career "takes off" on in Canada.

A disappointing component of the season was the need to introduce penalty patrols for repeated no shows. Individually, and collectively, we need to remember that all other surf activities are secondary to our primary purpose. From our club's constitution: We can't do that when patrolling members don't show up! Regrettably we had to scramble to get the minimum patrol numbers on the beach a couple times mostly early in the season. Put simply, if you don't want to or don't like to patrol you have joined the wrong club. Enough said.

There are a multitude of people I need to thank:

- The Patrol Captains these fifteen people took time out of their lives to manage their patrols on top of work, home and other commitments. Usually a simple task, a couple of times this season patrolling got a little tricky as a result of surf conditions, extreme heat and crowd numbers. Without their beach and people management skills the sand could have been a rabble. Needless to say, it wasn't.
- The Patrolling Members the success of this season lay at your feet, again.
- The Board Members lead by David Wymer, the (mostly new) board faced some challenging issues this season, had a number of expensive items to repair and/or replace and did it all with aplomb. The bulk of the board will remain for the 2018/2019 season to consolidate our club's position as a stand-out in the Sydney surf lifesaving community.
- Peta Fairlie and George Lewis we could not have replaced our former caretaker with a better couple. Always a friendly welcome, regardless of what time they went to bed after cleaning the hall and surrounds, the temperature or crowds. Their presence is a blessing.
- Heath and the council lifeguards working with this group was a pleasure again this year. Heath's laid back view of life opened my eyes to a different, and better, opinion on a number of topics this season.





- **Bendigo Bank** our boat shed is the envy of the northern beaches compliments of Bendigo Bank's generosity. Two new inflatable rescue boats (IRB) and four new outboard motors over the last 54 months is simply spectacular.
- **Phil Godbee** completely deserves his, recently awarded, life membership and works enough hours completing Bronze courses to earn another each season.
- Steve Atkins showed his continued form as a committed surf lifesaving man. A number of times "Spider" swam, skied or paddled as personal fitness early in the day, ran IRB crew training from 08:00, IRB driver training from 10:00 then Bronze training from 14:00, finishing up coincidently just as the bar opened. It exhausts me just thinking about it.
- Wiz and the training team without this group we would not have the patrolling numbers we do. Phil and Spider, senior trainers, are assisted by a dedicated junior team (for want of a better term) and steered in the right direction by Wiz.
- Mike Rasmussen (IRB), Greg Stretton (ATV) and Carmel Howard (First Aid) needs little introduction but maximum gratitude.

I entered surf lifesaving at a trying time in my life in an attempt to stay busy and meet some new people. Both were easy to do, such is the club we have. Now in my sixth season and after two years as Club Captain, I am as content and satisfied with my lot as ever, compliments to many in the club - and a few who aren't. Even the non-member locals acknowledge me and say hello. So much for the "insular peninsular".

About 33 years ago, my first and favourite Rugby coach explained why he stopped training our Under 8's team after two seasons: "They don't get sick of you and you don't get sick of them". Application of Brian's wisdom has worked well ever since. To that end I am standing down as Club Captain. Modern communication methods and styles, new thinking and ideas applied to old problems are a must in this role. The challenge is there for another.

Finally, on Saturday the 6th of January, the day before Sydney was the hottest place on the planet and our strip of sand was covered with thousands of beachgoers way beyond the 3rd gate, a young boy walked up behind me and said, very quietly, "Thanks for keeping me safe." Initially I was taken aback by his words. After thinking about it the truth is, since 1922, we have <u>all</u> kept him safe – those who started the club, those who have patrolled in the past and our current contingent. It's simply what we do at North Curl Curl.

Thanks for having me. It truly has been an honour.

EDUCATION

"During the course of the 2017/2018 season, 92 of our surf club members, ranging from 13 years of age through to a few of them over 60 years of age, collectively attained 128 Surf Life Saving Australia awards" Even though our surf club did not have as many club members as last season gain Surf Life Saving Australia awards, it was very pleasing to note that collectively 92 of them did attain a total of 128 awards during this past 2017/2018 season.

Of these 92 successful club candidates, 46 (exactly half) of them were adult club members and 34 were juniors (15 years to 18 years of age), with the remaining 12 being cadets (13 years and 14 years of age).

Probably the really good news this season was that courses conducted internally at or hosted by North Curl Curl S.L.S.C. accounted for approximately 110 of the 128 SLSA awards gained, with the remaining 18 SLSA qualifications being achieved through Branch facilitated courses.

The breakdown of successful candidates in each of the SLSA courses conducted during this season were as follows:-

- Bronze Medallion 29 successful candidates (25 internal, 4 external).
- Surf Rescue Certificate 12 successful candidates (10 internal, 2 external).
- Silver Med. Beach Management 1 successful candidate (external through Branch).
- IRB Driver's Licence 2 successful candidates (both internal).
- IRB Crewperson's Certificate 13 successful candidates (all internal).
- Provide Advanced Resuscitation 6 successful candidates (all internal via SLSNSW).
- Provide First Aid Certificate 54
 successful candidates 37 first time,17
 renewal, primarily internal via First Aid
 Plus).
- Spinal Management Certificate 11 successful candidates (external through Branch).

As has been the procedure in previous Annual Education Reports, the names of all of these recipients and the awards that they attained are listed at the end of this Education Report. Our surf club would like to thoroughly congratulate all of these successful club members for the diligent efforts that they produced in order to achieve these commendable results over this past season.

Also, as was indicated in last season's Annual Education Report, most of these results would not have been possible without the superb contributions of our surf club's diligent and highly motivated trainers, assessors and facilitators. Indeed, the ongoing wonderful efforts of these dedicated club personnel on behalf of North Curl Curl Surf Life Saving Club enabled most of the individuals concerned to achieve their very fine results.

Therefore, my sincere gratitude and that of our surf club goes to the following club trainers, trainee trainers and training assistants for the outstanding service that they have so willingly provided over this past 2017/2018 season:-

<u>Bronze Medallion</u> - Phil Godbee, Kaitlyn Smith, Steve (Spider) Atkins, David Jones,

Ray Merton, Michael Jones, Sophie Douneen and Max Puddicombe.

<u>Surf Rescue Certificate</u> - Natasha Spencer, Ray Merton and Alex (Wiz) Wye.

IRB Driver and Crew - Steve (Spider) Atkins with assistance from Matt O'Connor, David Young, Ben Dreghorn, Matt Truman, Kurt Wegenaar, David, Irvine, Jason Cooper and Luitz Koopman.

In addition, sincere appreciation goes to club assessors Clare Hagon, Steve Atkins, Phil Godbee and Ray Merton for conducting our surf club's annual proficiencies in the various SLSA awards which included Bronze Medallion, Surf Rescue Certificate, Provide Advanced Resuscitation, IRB Driver, IRB Crew and Spinal Management. During this past season, this was a massive task to accomplish, with several hundred SLSA awards being updated for over two hundred club members. These folk, along with the other club trainer assistants, completed this complex endeavour with high levels of competency.

When one considers that these same club assessors also represented our surf club by giving their time at numerous Sydney Northern Beaches Branch course assesments during the past season, the magnitude of their workload should never be underestimated.

Special acknowledgements must also go to the external facilitators who have assisted our club members in attaining valuable SLSA awards, with this first class group including First Aid Plus, Surf Life Saving NSW and Sydney Northern Beaches Branch.

First Aid Plus, which is run by Maryanne Troop and Gary Beauchamp conducted three Provide First Aid Certificate courses during the 2017/2018 season and as a result there were 54 successful candidates, an increase of 10 from the 2016/2017 season. Also, primarily through the tuition of First Aid Plus, 114 of our surf club's patrolling members now have their first aid qualification - thank you very much, Maz and Gaz.

Whilst only six club members attained their Provide Advanced Resuscitation Certificate during the season compared with 22 from the season before, it needs to be remembered that we already had 73 patrolling members with this award and therefore far less potential candidates to draw from than for previous seasons. Thanks, once again, goes to Gary Hyland from Surf Life Saving NSW who has been the main facilitator of this course for our surf club members over the past few seasons.

As has been the case in previous seasons, Sydney Northern Beaches Branch conducts the courses that allow our club (patrolling) members to gain both their Silver Medallion Beach Management (that is, Patrol Captains' status) and Spinal Management Certificate qualifications.

During this 2017/2018 season, our surf had one successful candidate and eleven successful candidates respectively in these two courses and our surf club thanks Branch and the respective facilitators involved for the tuition they provided in these two awards.

On reflection, our surf club's Education Portfolio has had another most successful season and it is important for us to build on these positive outcomes that have been achieved as we proceed into the forthcoming 2018/2019 surf patrol season.

During next season, our surf club will be striving to have its club (patrolling) members become even better qualified in the various SLSA awards, so as to improve the already fine functioning of its surf patrol teams.

As has been the policy in previous seasons, there should be two Bronze Medallion courses conducted in the 2018/2019 season, one before Christmas and the other in the New Year. Furthermore, there should be the usual pre-Christmas Surf Rescue Certificate course and several IRB Driver/Crew courses throughout the season.

First Aid Plus will again be asked to conduct at least two Provide First Aid Certificate courses, Surf Life Saving NSW will be requested to hold another Provide Advance Resuscitation Certificate course and as many patrolling members as possible will be sought to attend the various Branch conducted Silver Medallion Beach Management and Spinal Management Certificate courses.

During this past 2017/2018 season, several of our surf club's younger (or teenage) members were very actively involved in training other club members, especially in both Bronze Medallion squads, so it is our sincere wish that this excellent initiative not only continues, but is expanded upon during the forthcoming 2018/2019 season.

Finally, as well as acknowledging all of our club trainers and assessors in the Education Portfolio for their admirable work output and excellent results achieved, I would also like to thank them for the wonderful support that they have afforded me in the co-ordinating role that I have had to play in this portfolio for our surf club over the past two seasons.

Surf Education

This season we had a different approach to our compulsory Surf Ed sessions. We ran it on the beach rather than in the clubhouse (mostly).

Wiz volunteered his time and his teaching expertise to run Surf Ed along with keen SRCs to make it a little more engaging for the kids as well as focusing on topics that are generally not as practiced as part of normal Nippers sessions. There were also numerous make up sessions right up to New Year's Eve (thanks Wiz!) for those that could not make the main sessions.

This season we had a significant reduction in the numbers of Nippers getting their SRC awards – from 26 to 9 Nippers. A handful of those were due to wanting to wait for next season to do it with friends who did not quite reach the minimum age by the cut off. In the seasons going forward we need to find ways to make getting your SRC more appealing.

Junior Sports

Junior Sports' aim is to map a path from Nippers to Lifesavers. Sport is used as a vehicle develop and maintain vital Surf Life Saving skills as well as preserve Nippers' interest in staying on the SLS path. Over the last few years Nippers have already performed more than 10 Lifesaving rescues using skills taught during training.

Junior Competition Highlights of the season:

- 2nd at Branch (same place as last season – behind Manly by 283 points, 157 points closer than last season)
- 6th at State Same place as season but with only 6 points off 5th place compared to 28 last season.

I take it as my challenge to understand this role with the support of the other directors to work out how under this portfolio can best serve our members and provide the best possible club for all to enjoy.

It is with great pleasure that I can provide a summary of the key highlights for this year which reflect the great work the club and Board are doing for its members in the 2017/2018 season:

The life members lunch was held mid December 2017 in our new Members Area of the clubhouse. A fully catered sit-down meal for around twenty Life Members was provided with refreshments which created the perfect environment for all generations to catch up and reminisce on the old times. It also allowed the board the opportunity to update the life members on the great future plans it has for the club.

On a personal note it was nice to catch up with some of our older members to talk about the days gone past and to hear from their perspective what was important to them in relation to the club and the services it provides to its members.

One of the biggest nights on the members calendar was the Motown evening held on boxing day. A special thanks to Glenn Slater for having the vision to book the Dancing In The Shadows of Motown. The show featured a 9-piece band with an array of international performers was a very popular event, resulted in the dance floor and bar pumping with over 330 tickets sold and around \$11,000 of profits returned back to club.

The annual Golf Day was held on 27th December at Long Reef Golf Club where the whole course was booked out for a half day. Most players then returned to North Curl Curl Surf club for further refreshments and lunch and a few games of the famous hours racing game to continue the fund raising for the club. Numbers were slightly down from the previous years due to the scheduling of this event following the Motown evening. We saw some courageous efforts with some members managing to attend both events, including our President. Never the less the day managed to have a full running sheet of Ambrose golf with around 90 players taking part in the event. The weather was perfect and feedback from the

players were very positive due to the outstanding efforts of Danni arranging all the marketing material and Long Reef Gold Club for arranging the logistics in running the golf, catering the breakfast and keeping players hydrated out on the course. The day was a huge success with around \$5,000 raised. We must thank our sponsors: Built and Vivid for their kind contributions towards the day. Next years golf day has been pre-booked for 28 December 2018 so please save that date into your calendar.

One of the greatest assets to the members is the club house and the surrounding grounds. There have been a number of exciting initiatives being considered by the Board for the club house and grounds to be funded through a variety of community grants and club money.

The board approved \$10,000 towards developing a number of concept design options to improve the members area by carrying out internal modifications to the bar and kitchen. One of the grants conditions is that all the necessary planning approvals have to be in place to enable works to commence for the projects being put forward in the application. To ensure we put the right option forward, it was agreed that a working committee made up of a variety of club members be developed to assist with consulting the members on the options being proposed to confirm the final scheme to be put forward for adoption. The next phase would be to seek development consent, which can take up to six months. The next round of grant offers would be August 2019.

Laura Snyder has been assisting the board in managing the grant applications. One grant has been lodged seeking \$20,000 towards the nipper's storage. Notification of the application is expected in August 2018. There is another \$40,000 application being considered for the upgrade of the blinds and to install some ceiling fans into the members area which will also include some upgrade of electrical works to the club.

The club was also successful in obtaining \$25,000 of grant funding towards the upgrade of the BBQ area with long needed improvements to the landscaping, including new plantings and pathways to make the space more family user friendly. It is expected that these works will commence in August 2018 and be completed in time for the first patrol of 2018/19 season. The Board also commenced upgrading the tables and chairs in the club during the season, which we received an overwhelming response from all the patrons using the facility at bottles regarding how much they liked the new furniture.

MEMBER SERVICES

There were a number of successful awards nights, including the Nippers Awards afternoon and the main event hosted by DY RSL. I would like to acknowledge and thank Laura Snyder and

Danni Petkovic for all their efforts arranging the evening and to Glenn Slater and Harry Prowse for keeping the crowd entertained, making the night a huge success focusing on the youth in the club and acknowledging all the awards obtained over the season.

I would like to personally thank Mike Rasmussen, who was my deputy throughout the season, for his endless enthusiasm and great ideas regarding ways to constantly improve the club's facilities and my fellow Board of Directors for all of your support and guidance in my first year on the Board. "The financial results for the year were solid" Members, it is my pleasure to present to you the attached Financial Statements for North Curl Curl Surf Club for the financial year 2018, period 1 May 2017 to 30 April 2018.

Overall the financial results for the year were solid and comparable with past seasons. This in light of some changes both in key personnel up to board level and with the transition to a new cloud based financial and accounting system 'Xero'. Whilst there is still a fair way to go in transitioning to a modern integrated financial and reporting system, the process is well on the way.

It is pleasing to note that the Club posted a net profit for the year of \$61,726 after allowing for Depreciation and Amortization of the clubs Fixed Assets of \$77,305. This is up from \$33,301 from the same

period last year and that of the recent financial years.

Cash reserves also increased by \$82,757 leaving our cash holdings at the end of the financial year at \$227,354 again a pleasing result. Like each and every year, the clubs cash position is reliant upon the fund-raising activities of Members as well as the support of our Donors and Sponsors. A big thank you to you all for your efforts and contributions this year, without your help and the kind assistance provided, both financial and otherwise, we would not be able to facilitate the services to our Members and the public at our beach at its current level.

Major fundraising events again contributed significantly to our cash reserves, the usual suspects the 3 Points Challenge and Ocean Swim, and the Annual Golf Day once again proving popular events. This year also saw the introduction of other major social and fund-raising events with the club hosting a band and dinner evening called 'Motown' and State of Origin nights.

All these events were a great success, and more so than that is outlined in the accounts with the catering, bar sales and some supplementary incomes otherwise recognized in the financials as I will outline later in my report. A big thank you to Louise Tassone and his team with the 3 points, David Wymer and his team for the golf day, Glenn Slater and Danni Petkovic and their team for the Motown night and Robert Killian and his merry men and women for the State of Origin. Apologies if I have overlooked anyone for a special mention.

Our Social revenues increased significantly during the period from \$36,973 in 2017 to \$96,680 in 2018. The profit margin also increasing to 39%. This revenue has traditionally come predominantly from the Friday and Sunday Social activities (Bottles) reasonably estimated at \$42,000 plus for the year. A great effort all round

with a special thanks to David Wymer for his tireless efforts and co-ordination of the running and stocking of the bar for Bottles and these events

This year however Social income includes other social activities such as the Motown, and Golf Day sales along with other events such as the State of Origin evening. Due in part to the increased usage of the merchant terminals (EFTPOS) and a revised catering contract has made it procedurally difficult to identify payments and allocate the revenue to a specific event. Please understand that every effort was made to review and reconcile these takings, however for various reasons it was logistically not possible It is important that for the new season that a process is identified and information is captured at the point of sale, be it electronic or otherwise, so that sales can be categorized and identified at their origin and the payment method also identified, captured and stored. Hall revenue increased again after the completion of the renovations and is still expected to increase with ever increasing enquiries and bookings. The net hall income increased to \$17,934 in the year. Thank you to Peter Fairlie and George Lewis our Caretakers who have kept the club in immaculate condition and well maintained and continue to manage the bookings and enquiries for the Hall.

Sponsorships and Donations this financial year totaled \$108,915 which is fantastic and up nearly 10% on last years revenue. All money received is greatly appreciated and provides us with much needed funds to run the Club.

We make special mention of these benefactors, John Huston, David Jones and Family, Bendigo Bank, Freshwater Plumbing, LJ Hooker, East Coast Electrical, Ian Westmore Dentistry, GJ Gardiner Homes, The Cool Cats, Nine Network, Harbord Financial, RJ Thomas Solicitors, Warringah Council and Dee Why RSL on behalf of all members we thank you once again for your generosity towards the Club, none of us take light the magnitude of your support. Again, apologies if I have overlooked anyone for a special mention.

Grants income was also up on past years at \$34,657. With the introduction of paid role to identify and apply for Grants it is expected that the revenue achieved from grants, whether private or through the government will continue to grow.

Finally, the Clothing Department increased sales in the financial year. Whilst the profit for the year as somewhat less than previous, significant efforts were made to clear out old and obsolete stock which has reflected in a reduced profit from sales. A big thank you to Ann Allsop and Vic Howell for the years' work, a difficult and thankless task in managing the "fashion" expectations of members at an affordable price.

In closing, I want to personally thank the Board including one Colin Wilson for all their valuable assistance, support and work during the year. We are all volunteers trying to manage the challenges of family, work and life and it is comforting to know that all these efforts have gone a long way this year and have laid the future for new era for the surf club.

1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

This financial report is a special purpose financial report in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (NSW) and the Charitable Fundraising Act and Regulations. The Committee has determined that the Club is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the following Australian Accounting Standards:

AASB 1031 Materiality

AAS8 110: Events Occurring After Reporting Date

No other Australian Accounting Standard, Urgent Issues Consensus Views or other authoritative pronouncement of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied.

The financial report is also prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following material accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report:

Property, Plant & Equipment and Furniture & Fittings

Property, plant and equipment are included at cost or, where indicated, at independent or Directors' valuation. All assets, excluding freehold land and buildings are depreciated at the applicable rate to write off the cost of the assets over their estimated useful life.

The Leasehold Improvements have been capitalised and are amortised over the remaining life of the lease.

<u>Inventories</u>

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost or net realisable value. Costs are assigned on a first-in first-out basis and include direct materials, direct labour and an appropriate portion of fixed overhead expenses.

<u>Income Tax</u>

The Club is a public benevolent institution and consequently its income is exempt from paying income tax.

Fundraising Activities.

These Financial Statements include all fundraising activities carried out by the Club for the period (see note 7).
